WALKING

Alpha has lots of interesting and easy walks around the town area. Home to 28 murals, a shady lined main street of albizia and ficus trees with public toilets. A pie from Snow's bakery is a must.

JANE NEVILLE ROLFE ART GALLERY

Dryden Street

Collection of local arts and pottery from talented local artists. Gold Coin entry. For access contact Tanya McDonell at the Tourist Information Centre.

TIVOLI THEATRE MUSEUM

Located behind the tourist office in Shakespeare Street. Inside view a collection of early settlers gear - saddlery, railway and stock wears. The latest addition to the museum a mural generously painted by a Grey Nomad.

ALPHA DIP YARDS

Located behind the Alpha Showgrounds. An easy walk from the town centre.

The Alpha Dip Yards are utilised to dip cattle before entry to non tick areas. Built in its location due to its close proximity to the rail line which was the main means of cattle transport however in more recent times road transport has taken over.

ALPHA CEMETERY

Located on the fringe of town along the Clermont Road. Neatly maintained, with a lot of history, with a special garden in the crematorium section.

BLACK BRIDGE

Easy stroll down the lower end of Shakespeare Street. Built by the Railway for the Railway. In 1941 a Rail engine travelling from Rockhampton to Longreach carrying 270 passengers, mostly soldiers going back to the Townsville. Army Barracks went through the bridge killing the driver and a fireman.

ALPHA GOLF CLUB

Easy walk from town centre overlooking Alpha. 18 hole course.
