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## 1 INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 Listening to Our Community

In March 2025, Barcaldine Regional Council undertook a comprehensive community survey designed to better understand how our residents perceive the services we deliver, and what matters most to them. This initiative reflects Council's commitment to listen, learn, and lead with purpose — guided not only by statutory obligations but also by the voices of those who call our Barcaldine Region home.

The survey forms the first step in a new chapter for Council's strategic planning. With the current Corporate Plan nearing its conclusion, we are setting the groundwork for a refreshed plan — one shaped not only by organisational insight but also by the priorities, aspirations, and expectations of our community.

### 1.2 Purpose

This community survey was undertaken to establish a baseline for community sentiment around the services Council delivers. The survey was structured to provide insight into:

- Benchmarking the performance of Council's services
- Understanding those services the community consider important
- Hearing the community priorities
- Informing the first stages of priority for Council's New Corporate Plan.

### 1.3 What We Set Out to Do

Council's intent for the survey was clear: to establish a meaningful baseline of community sentiment that will serve as a foundation for decision-making in the years ahead. Specifically, the survey aimed to:

- **Benchmark performance across Council's key services:** to understand how we are tracking in the eyes of our community.
- **Identify importance:** highlighting which services our residents value most, ensuring our future investments align with what truly matters.
- **Capture priorities:** offering a platform for residents to voice what they believe should be our focus going forward.
- **Inform strategic planning:** directly influencing the early development of Council's next Corporate Plan by anchoring it in community insight.

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#### 1.4 Why This Matters

As a small regional Council, we know that “doing more with less” isn’t just a catchphrase, it’s a reality we live every day. That’s why understanding where our efforts have the greatest impact is so critical. This survey ensures that the next iteration of our Corporate Plan is built on a foundation of local relevance, shaped by community values, and positioned for long-term sustainability.

Whether you’re a resident, business owner, community group or visitor — your input is helping shape the future of the Barcaldine Region.

#### 1.5 About the Barcaldine Region

Barcaldine Regional Council serves five communities in central western Queensland, with an estimated resident population of 2,900. We cover an area of 53,520 km2. The social fabric of each district is unique but resilience and local community spirit are traits that run deep across the region.

Rural industries, including sheep and cattle grazing, are the traditional mainstays of the local economy. They are supported by small businesses and public services, including State Government agencies. The renewable energy sector is an emerging industry with early development in progress. Tourism is important for local traders with the much needed economic injection during the cooler months. We are fortunate to have attractions of national, state and local historical significance. A growing Indigenous cultural presence, natural landscapes, and garden-lined streetscapes add to the region’s character.

#### 1.6 About the Survey

The survey contained five sections for each respondent to complete. These sections were general survey questions, service satisfaction, service priorities, qualitative questions and demographics. There was also a specific question about the respondent’s support for renewal energy being part of the region’s economic future. Each respondent was asked to select three services they consider our priorities and then rate each service’s satisfaction. The results for the survey have converted the individual scores from surveys to numbers to score all questions out of 5.

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## 2 THE SURVEY RESPONSES

A total of 266 responses were received from residents across the Barcaldine Regional Council area. This represents a strong and diverse sample for a community-wide survey, particularly across a dispersed rural region, this represents just under 10% of the region.

Barcaldine, as the largest township, accounted for half of all responses (50%), providing a robust base for town-level analysis. Smaller communities like Muttburra (13) and Jericho (22) are less represented but still provide meaningful insights into these communities. This distribution mirrors the population scale across the region and gives Council a useful benchmark for future engagement rates. Additionally, there were two surveys completed by people from outside of the Barcaldine Region.

The majority of responses came from adults aged 31–65 years (140 people), indicating strong engagement from working-age and early retirement demographics. There was a solid response from seniors (70 people over 65), while participation from younger residents was relatively low. Future efforts may focus on youth and young adult engagement, potentially through schools or targeted digital platforms.

Households with families and couples made up the bulk of responses. The 95 responses from families with children highlight a significant demographic that may shape demand for community services like parks, childcare, youth programs, and education. Meanwhile, single-person households and older residents are also well-represented, reflecting the region's mix of lifestyles and potential vulnerabilities in terms of access and service equity.







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
### 3 COUNCIL PRIORITIES

The survey undertaken by Barcaldine Regional Council shows what the community are saying are the services Council should focus on. These services when paired with satisfaction ratings can then start to paint a picture of priorities for Council as set by the members of the community. The matrix below shows the performance rating of the service on the vertical axis. This is the average rating out of five for the service. The horizontal axis shows the level of priority recorded by the survey respondents.




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3.1 Overall Service Priorities

### 3.3 Priority - Roads and Transport

The highest priority service set by survey respondents is Council's Roads and Transport. This service is Council's biggest asset and plays a key role in connecting communities. This service was listed in the top three priorities across most demographics.

#### Community Identified Actions

##### 1. Desire for more consistent and higher-quality rural road maintenance

Community feedback highlighted strong expectations for more frequent and a better standard of maintenance on rural roads. Many respondents expressed that current grading and repair cycles feel insufficient, particularly following wet seasons or periods of high use. There is a clear call for a more reliable approach to rural road upkeep.

##### 2. Interest in long-term road upgrades to improve safety and access

Respondents commonly raised the need for strategic upgrades—such as widening narrow sealed sections, sealing priority unsealed roads, and addressing known safety concerns. These comments reflect a community interest in improvements that support safer travel and enhance connectivity across the region.

##### 3. Expectations of improved town streetscapes, drainage and local amenity

Many comments focused on the presentation and functionality of town areas. Feedback pointed to the desire for cleaner gutters, improved drainage, better patching of town streets, and general attention to the small details that contribute to a well-maintained and appealing streetscape.

##### 4. Emerging feedback on transport access and community mobility

While not as dominant as road-related comments, some respondents raised the importance of transport options—particularly for seniors or residents needing to travel for medical or essential services. This feedback suggests a growing interest in improving access to transport and mobility support across the region.

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### 3.4 Priority – Community Care and NDIS

Much like Roads, Community Care and NDIS has been listed across most demographics as a priority. This is a service Council operates largely through funding from State and Commonwealth agencies to provide in home care, support and care plan management for some of the most vulnerable residents in our community.

#### Community Identified Actions

##### 1. Desire for improved access to aged care and home support services

A significant number of respondents expressed concerns about the current level of support available to older residents, particularly the ability to remain living independently at home. Feedback highlighted challenges in accessing timely assistance, shortages of support workers, and difficulties for elderly residents in smaller towns such as Alpha. These comments reflect a broader community desire for more consistent, reliable and accessible aged care support across the region.

##### 2. Calls for strengthened Community Care Service communication

Many submissions raised concerns about the effectiveness, responsiveness and communication of Community Care Services. Respondents pointed to issues such as limited staff availability, inconsistent communication with clients, and service gaps during illness or staff shortages. This feedback suggests a community expectation for clearer communication, more visible staffing presence, and a more coordinated approach to delivering support.

##### 3. Desire for expanded community transport and social inclusion programs

Respondents highlighted the importance of transport options for accessing medical appointments, essential services and community activities—particularly for seniors and residents without private transport. Alongside this, some comments expressed a desire for more social, recreational and wellbeing activities to help older residents stay connected and engaged. Together, this feedback reflects community interest in both improved mobility support and stronger opportunities for social inclusion across the region.

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### 3.5 Priority – Animal Management

Animal Management was identified across the region as the lowest level of service satisfaction of all Council services and in Barcaldine was specifically identified by one in three respondents as a focus area.

#### Community Identified Actions

##### 1. Strong community concern about roaming, aggressive and uncontained animals

Across all towns, respondents repeatedly raised concerns about roaming dogs—particularly those that are aggressive, intimidating, or not properly contained in yards. Many residents noted that walking around their community, even with a leashed dog, can be difficult due to roaming animals. This feedback reflects a strong desire for better containment of pets, improved safety for pedestrians, and more visible compliance with existing requirements.

##### 2. A desire for enforcement of local laws and limits on animal numbers

A recurring theme was the perception that animal-related local laws are not being consistently enforced. Comments highlighted issues such as households keeping large numbers of dogs, unregistered animals, barking disturbances, and animal-related nuisance behaviour. Community sentiment points to a desire for clearer enforcement, greater accountability for owners, and stronger application of existing regulations.

##### 3. Community interest in a more proactive and resourced animal management approach

Some respondents expressed frustration that animal management services feel limited or non-existent. Suggestions ranged from more regular patrols to dedicated staff with enough independence and authority to enforce the rules. This reflects a broader expectation for a more proactive, responsive and well-resourced approach to managing animal issues—including dogs, cats, and in some cases livestock and roosters.

### 3.6 Priority – Parks and Gardens


Parks and Gardens was rated as the only service which was categorised to optimise as opposed to prioritise by respondents. The overall rating of the service was between fair to satisfied. However, the service was identified as a focus area for Council, with suggestions of improvements and uplifts in service levels requested by the community. The table below contains the feedback from respondents and the actions suggested by the community. There is a little bit of cross over with Roads and Transport with a number of comments relating to the streetscape of the main streets in each town.

Community Identified Actions
<b>1. Strong desire for improved maintenance and presentation of town streetscapes</b> Many respondents highlighted concerns about the general upkeep of gardens, lawns and public spaces—particularly in main streets and high-visibility areas. Comments frequently mentioned dead or dying plants, inconsistent watering, unmaintained garden beds and a loss of the “garden city” character that many people associate with Barcaldine and the region. This reflects a community expectation for more consistent, reliable and high-quality maintenance practices, this was particularly noted in comments from Barcaldine respondents.
<b>2. Interest in revitalising and beautifying parks, entrances and shared spaces</b> A significant number of comments focused on the look and feel of major parks, entry points into towns and key public spaces. Suggestions included more colour in garden beds, increased tree planting, upgraded signage, and use of plants better suited to local conditions. Some respondents also noted pride in well-kept areas, indicating strong community interest in ongoing beautification rather than one-off upgrades.
<b>3. Need for upgraded, safe and inclusive playgrounds and family spaces</b> Feedback highlighted a desire for better play spaces for children, particularly facilities that cater to younger age groups. Some parks were described as outdated, too small, or lacking safety features, shade, seating or toilets. Respondents see parks as important for liveability and community connection, and expressed interest in more attractive, accessible and family-friendly recreation areas.
<b>4. Community appetite for more reliable maintenance practices</b> Several comments pointed out issues with inappropriate plant selections, poor planting timing, and irrigation systems running during rain. There was also interest in more sustainable, locally suitable plantings and better checking of sprinkler systems. This suggests a desire for a more planned, consistent and climate-responsive approach to how parks and gardens are established and maintained
<b>5. Interest in exploring alternative models for maintaining green spaces</b> A small but thoughtful cluster of comments raised the idea of involving community groups, volunteers or local contractors where appropriate—particularly in high-profile spaces. This reflects community curiosity about different ways to support parks and gardens in our communities

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#### 4 SPECIAL QUESTION

In the community survey this year Council asked for feedback regarding renewal energy in the Barcaldine Region. This section provides insight in to the responses to the question *“How supportive are you of renewal energy projects (wind, hydrogen, solar) being a part of a future economic strategy for the Barcaldine Region?”*

## 5 INDIVIDUAL SERVICE SUMMARIES

In this section each service is examined for its performance and the comments and response by our community.

### 5.1 Airports

**Question: With these focus areas in mind, which projects are the most important for each of these services?**

*Airport (I work at the airport): (a) the check-in area is a tin shed below standard. The heat generated requires the aircon to run constantly at low temperature so the essential aviation equipment doesn't shut down. Even then the fan on the equipment screams loudly to help keep it below excessive temp. (b) Floor coverings: A former occupant supplied some carpeting on the concrete floor, which is now tattered and could well be a trip/fall risk. Proper floor covering such as vinyl or fake wood panelling would make the experience for travellers more pleasant and be easier for passengers to bring in wheeled luggage for checking in. (c) The check-in area as it currently exists must leave any departing passengers with a poor impression. (d) The signage to and from the airport is very poor as it currently exists. The words in the cut out metal get lost/confused by the variegated background vegetation. In my view the signs need a white panel across the rear so the welcoming signs stand out.*

*Planting trees, upgrading airport facility, there is not much for tourists and no where to eat, the ski park is a great facility but need the cafe to be running.*



**Question: With these focus areas in mind, which projects are the most important for each of these services?**

*Reduce the number of straying dogs and cats*

*More needs to be done about the number of dogs straying about town*

*With the constant ongoing concern with the amount of animals each household have and concerns with the wondering dogs*

*Barking and stray dogs. Households having too many dogs.*

*Animal control, WAY too many dogs are out and about causing absolute chaos in town. Hopping fences, attacking other dogs and even people out on what should be a quiet relaxing walk for most. Nothing is being done, the same people get away with it time and time again and do not care how it effects others in town.*

*Better management of stray dogs - ensure they are contained in their yards so they don't harass people who are walking past.*

*Roaming dogs also an issue.*

*At the moment we have no animal management services and it is difficult to walk your leashed dog around town without coming into contact with loose dogs. We need a fifo pest management person. One who is not attached to the community and so can follow the laws and make impartial decisions.*

*Animal control where's council by laws for keeping animal. Blocks keeping lots of dogs ect more than aloud.*

*manage stray dogs in town.*

*Animal - it does not exist. e.g. dogs' roosters in town. 5+ dogs seem to be allowed not registered, not contained, bark all day. Roosters crow all night.*

*Address animal issues - so many barking dogs in town, people with too many pets then on the other hand we have no appropriate paddocks to keep horses.*

*There does not appear to be any management applied to these services. Animal control (roaming dogs) is out of control in Barcaldine.*

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**Question: With these focus areas in mind, which projects are the most important for each of these services?**

*Council need to employ a dog patrol officer, who will do the job. Not someone that turns a blind eye and does nothing. My next-door Neighbour has 5 to 6 dogs and the stench from their droppings is unbearable.*

*Ensuring our community is protected from dangerous dogs*

*rewrite bylaws to keep better control of dogs around town, enforce the laws,*

*the whole 3- animal management- council needs to enforce a bit of regulation when it comes to dogs not being registered, wandering and the amount people have. Employ someone to come in and go it each house and deal with the dog situation in each town.*

*Local law enforcement, dogs unlimited number, attacking other people's pets, no reputation's*

*Animal Management - Dogs barking and roaming, day and night. Dogs lunging at fence, raised hackles.*

*Animal Management - Feel safe to walk your dog on a lead, Dog rego included in rates*

*Animal Management - Barking & Wandering dogs need to be managed.*

*Animals- Contain stray animals and manage the number per household, control barking*

*Animal control of dogs and roosters in the town area.*

*NO MORE THAN 2 DOGS MAX. CARE OF THESE DOGS*

*Many roaming dogs*

*Animals need to be controlled.*

*Regulation and containment of dogs and feral animals in town.*

*Animal control - too many yards with more than 2 dogs and not registered and just are put out of sight.*

*Problem with roaming and barking dogs everywhere in town.*

*Enforce by laws - dogs.*

*Impounding of animals not contained in yards;*

*Animals (mainly dogs) need to be kept in own yards/restrained (not roam streets).*

*Manage dangerous and aggressive dogs as well as too many dogs.*

*Animal Management: Roaming dogs have been an issue for a long time and it is the single biggest complaint I hear from visitors.*

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**Question: With these focus areas in mind, which projects are the most important for each of these services?**

Constantly barking dogs are a real problem for many residents. Council has often said in newsletters etc. "By far the highest number of complaints Council receives is complaints about animals". Well... the only way that is going to change is if Council does something about it. Many, many residents are sick to death of dog owners not keeping their animals under control. We have to put up with constant barking because some owners get dogs, then go to work all day and while they're at work sometimes their dogs never shut up at all, or constantly bark every time anything moves in their area, whereas a well trained dog should only bark while playing or if a stranger enters their property. Recently we've seen people who know they have a problem dog get another dog to "keep the original dog quiet". While it might be good in theory, what happens most of the time is the problem dog teaches the new dog the same damn bad habits because there's no owner present to teach them otherwise. Why should other residents who do the right thing and keep their animals under control, and those residents who choose to not have animals have to put up with that?

Animal control (particularly dog control) seems non-existent in Barcaldine (not sure about other towns). Wandering, aggressive dogs, barking dogs, and have counted up to seven dogs at some premises. Very high risk for Council that a child will be seriously injured or worse.

Animals roam freely sometimes vicious, with some places with several dogs [not working dogs] many causing disturbance to Neighbours.

**Question: In your view, what needs to happen for the community to think this term of Council has been a success?:**

Take steps to shut the damn dogs up around the town and heavily fine those who do not keep their dogs under control.

Stop penalising those who are fed up and try to report problem dogs by making them have to jump through all sorts of hoops that in the end result in very little, if anything, of substance being done to try and curb this problem.

Want to know where a lot of the problem barking dogs are?

Walk around town with a dog on a leash.

Dogs need to managed. Constat barking at night is unacceptable.






*No, but there are a lot of resources put into services other Councils don't have to provide e.g. banking*

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*It is difficult to balance because part of the value of living here is more autonomy.*


*Not selling out to developers, restricting any potential growth of short term accommodation similar to Airbnb that will take away housing opportunities from families looking for homes.*



Barcaldine Regional Council has totally dropped the ball with Home and Community Care. The current level of service is below poor and with the centralisation of management of HACC to Barcaldine the service is sub-standard, communication with clients is poor or non existent.

Improvement in capacity for home and community care services for elderly persons to ensure that community members can remain in their homes as long as possible. As without support community members are forced to relocate for additional support services and potentially be forced to reside in supported accommodation located outside of this district. Currently service is deficient due to staff illness.

I need a lot of care and am finding it difficult about getting support workers to assist me.

Community Care is far below what should be expected in an elderly community. Many people have had to move away from Alpha to receive the care that they should be entitled to receive in Alpha. The whole community care organization is just an embarrassment to the community and a waste of money with the current employees running it and needs to be overhauled with fulltime, efficient, trained and pro-active staff. It is impossible to run the community care effectively with a limited hours/ part time \*\*\*\*\* working \*\*\*\*, who in hindsight is rarely at work or available to help the elderly. The social events provided for the elderly from the community care is ZERO and a disgrace and severely impacts their health.

I do feel though that communities like ours can receive significant economic opportunities by being able to deliver projects and solve problems that no one else can. Barcy Red, which I think has enormous potential cannot be done in Noosa or Rockhampton or Townsville, but it can be done here. The "CUBS" or cashed up bogans/tradies are a group who have money to spend but limited places to spend it on the coast. Examples like the Hatfield McCoy trails in the USA, where you can not only ride dirt bikes but also ATVs and side by sides, has brought thousands of people into rural parts of Alabama as they simply cannot undertake this activity in more populated centres (<https://trailsheaven.com/>) I feel we have the same opportunity to target those people who love adventure. Lets become "outback Queenstown" by solving a problem for those who have invested in adventure yet cannot undertake it in their backyard. I think its an "all" conversation not an "or" conversation especially when we have such large areas to use ie the common could easily host barcy red and adventure trail runners and mountain bikers etc etc, maybe not all on the same weekend but certainly we have a model that we can add to so all benefit. Better still these models can easily be applied to other communities ie barcy red can easily branch out and become barcy red and aramac/jericho/muttaburra red as they to have ample space around their townships thus maximising the return of the model and the region.*

*Promoting and leading the RAPAD Powergrid project as an economic and environmental win for the BRC area to build a legacy that will ensure ongoing development in our region;*

Unfortunately Barcys main street is the worst I have seen it since I came in the late 90's. The garden city of the west is certainly not living up to its namesake at the moment. I fully appreciate the difficulty of keeping keen gardeners on council crews and as such would suggest alternatives are sought out. A suggestion is to advertise for an EOI to see if local community groups or contractors maybe interested in taking this work off councils hands thus not only freeing those staff up to work on more profitable jobs but also allowing those with the passion for gardening and to help make town really shine.*
